2 part, the smaller of which is built on the footprint of the original log cabin; both parts, however, were built at the same consisting of the 2.5 story, 3 bay, main block with a recessed 1.5 story, 3 bay wing. Both sections of the house have a gable roof, the 1.5 story section has a stone interior end chimney and two gable roof dormers; this section also has a shed roof kitchen addition on its outer gable wall; 6/6; the 2.5 story section is 2 pile, with 1 stone interior end chimney; stone relieving arches are located above the first floor openings on this section as well; the east wall retains a stucco finish.

Each section of the house has datestones on it. Main block has a stone at ground level on the gable end facing the kitchen wing, the stone is only partially legible reading "T&MM 175\_". There are 2 other commemorative datestones located on upper quoins, on the south elevation: "Sarah \* Hannah Merrick, September the 24th anno 1781". Another on the gable reads: "John Merrick, September the 24th anno 1781". Above the door on the south elevation of the 1 story kitchen wing is a stone marked "RM 1781".

"Brookwood" & "Taylor-Cadwallader Farm"

Originally constructed in the eighteenth century, the house was enlarged and altered during the early to mid 19th century. When the property was purchased by a New Yorker a century later, it underwent a major renovation in the Colonial Revival style. Physical and documentary evidence suggests that the oldest extant portion of the house dates to the eighteenth century. If the "B S T" inscription refers to Benjamin Taylor, this would date this 1738 to 1780. Tax records confirm a stone house on the property in circa 1795. The current barn was not noted. Associated with tenant house # 918 Highland Rd.
