Historical Notes:
This is the only house in the township with a gambrel roof. Other examples of 18th century gambrel roof houses in Bucks County are only 1 story high. The 1709 date comes from Anna Shaudys, a former owner, who remembers the datestone (now missing) on the east gable wall. The house is at the head of one of the township's earliest grants.

The main block is attributed to William Van Horn who owned the property from 1772 until his death in c.1820. William Van Horn's name does not appear in any of the standard Bucks County histories; he was the son of Bernard Van Horn who divided an almost 452 acre tract between his 3 sons in 1772.

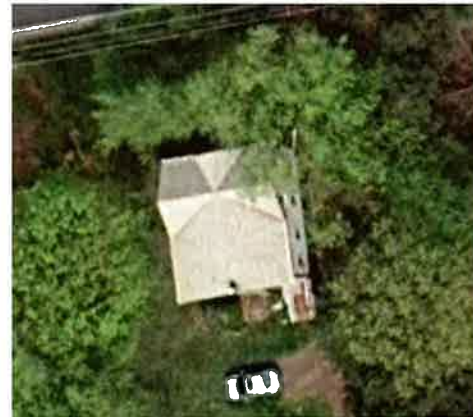
