EXECUTIVE SESSION:

I. Heron’s Watch Conservation Easement Draft Letter Discussion.

As written, the current Heron’s Watch Conservation Easement makes any type of driveway entry adornments (*i.e.* entry piers with and without lighting, fences, mailboxes with street number, etc.) a violation. Easements written later are much more tolerant of such typical residential structures. With such structures erected at Heron’s Watch the EAC has been discussing ways to amend the current easement to allow for, but not encroach on the current easement. One alternative considered was strict enforcement was deemed to time and resource consuming. Second alternative is too costly to modify all the deeds and bring the easement to compliance. The EAC has decided for Steve Moyer to create a draft letter to the residents to educate the terms of the current easement,
