# **Upper Makefield Reviewing Tree Restoration** Plans

#### PECO service upgrade work required tree removal

PECO's efforts earlier this year to improve reliable power service to Upper Makefield residents had some unintended consequences: The changed landscape from tree and vegetation removal alarmed some residents.

Now the Township's Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) is reviewing 6 proposals from landscape architects to develop a work area restoration plan. With recommendations from the EAC, the Township Board of Supervisors expect to approve and initiate a restoration project to begin this fall or early spring 2018. The restoration project will include portions of Taylorsville Road and River Road.

PECO's electric service enhancement project is meant to improve load capacity and reliability. Importantly, they aim to restore power faster after an outage. The PECO work area includes Taylorsville Road, Washington Crossing Memorial Boulevard, River Road south of Route 532, and the section of Mt. Eyre Road east of Taylorsville Road and will include some new poles and significant wire and equipment upgrades.

The PECO project is set for completion in late November.

## **Eagle Scout Project Means New Fencing at Brownsburg Park**

Council Rock North High School student Steve Jayne worked in May to install about 165 feet of new fencing at Brownsburg Park.

The fence is meant to create a barrier to the soccer field (and errant soccer balls) and the park's no-mow area, where ticks can be found. It also protects the no-mow area.

The public service project was part of Jayne's work toward



Eagle Scout designation. The work included fundraising and organizing fencebuilding labor from family and friends. The Patriot FC soccer club made a generous donation to the project, he said.

"I had a great experience working with Upper Makefield Township to complete my project," said Jayne in a follow-up email to the Township.

#### **Board of Supervisors Resolves to Oppose Proposed PennEast Pipeline**

A proposal by PennEast Pipeline Company to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission offers two routes for a new pipeline that will affect Upper Makefield Township and other parts of Bucks County.

In their opposition to both the original and alternate pipeline routes, the Supervisors unanimously approved a Resolution on May 17, 2017, which states that "the proposed pipeline may negatively affect the health, safety, welfare and quality of life of the residents of Upper Makefield Township."

#### **BOWMA Seeks Access to Private Properties** for 2017-18 Deer Management Program

As an Upper Makefield Township property owner, you can help the entire community by granting BOWMA hunters access to your property.



Upper Makefield Township contracts annually with the Big Oak Whitetail Management (BOWMA) to reduce the community's deer population. BOWMA hunters are

interviewed and evaluated by BOWMA and must submit criminal background checks to the Township. They can be identified by a Township-issued ID card and dashboard placard.
