# **Upper Makefield Board of Supervisors October 1, 2024 Meeting Minutes**

The October 1, 2024 public meeting of the Upper Makefield Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chair Yvette Taylor at 7:30 p.m. In attendance were the following members of the Board of Supervisors: Chair Yvette Taylor, Vice Chair Ben Weldon, Treasurer Braun Taylor, Member Tom Cino and Member Tim Thomas. Also in attendance were Township Manager David R. Nyman, Assistant Township Manager Judy Caporiccio, Township Solicitor Mary Eberle, Esq., Township Engineer Amanda Fuller, P.E., and Planning & Zoning Director Denise Burmester, and Chief Mark Schmidt.

## CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Ms. Taylor led in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance, which was followed by a moment of silence.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Priscilla Linden, 50 Dillon Way, brought damaged political signs collected since the last meeting to demonstrate what she believes are intended to intimidate stating that the incidences have become more frequent and violent.

Mr. Cino stated that election signs for both parties are being vandalized, and he encouraged reporting it to the police.

Kathy Budd, 1295 River Road, expressed appreciation for the lowered speed limit on River Road but remains concerned about continued speeding and excessive noise levels from vehicles and motorcycles. She requested increased enforcement of speed and noise violations.

Ellen Goldblatt, 1299 River Road, requested a professional evaluation of the noise concerns on River Road.

## APPROVAL OF MINUTES AND BILLS PAYABLE

A motion was made by Mr. Cino and seconded by Mr. Weldon to approve the September 17, 2024 Budget Workshop meeting minutes. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

## **PLANNING & ZONING ISSUES**

## Gasperi Zoning Hearing Board Application, 736 Towerview Drive

Chelsey Crocker Jackman Esq. and Vince Fioravanti, P.E. represented the applicant and provided an overview of the Gasperi Zoning Hearing Board Application requesting variances for front and side yard setbacks and building coverage for construction of a detached garage, front porch, side living space and attached covered rear porch. A stormwater management rain garden is proposed, and the existing septic system has been deemed viable. Following the discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Cino and seconded by Mr. Weldon to take a neutral position regarding the requested variances. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

## Kaniewski Planning Module, 2955 Windy Bush Road

Ms. Burmester provided an overview of the Kaniewski Planning Module application proposing the installation of six new on-lot sewage disposal systems to serve six new single-family homes, noting that an existing dwelling on the property will be demolished. Discussion followed and a motion was made by Mr. Cino and seconded by Mr. Weldon to approve the Kaniewski Planning Module. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

#### **SOLICITOR'S REPORT**

#### **Grinder Pump Ordinance Public Hearing**

Ms. Eberle provided an overview of the Grinder Pump Ordinance. Ms. Taylor opened the public hearing. There were no comments by the Board of Supervisors and no comments from the public. Ms. Taylor closed the public hearing. A motion was made by Mr. Cino and seconded by Mr. Weldon to adopt the Grinder Pump Ordinance. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

# Adoption of Conditional Use Adjudication, 1292 Taylorsville Road (Weyant)

Ms. Eberle provided a summary of the conditions of the Weyant Conditional Use Adjudication for 1292 Taylorsville Road as follows:

- The Applicant shall demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Township, compliance with all the requirements of JMZO Section 803.16.B.
- The dwelling unit in the barn shall be the principal use of the Property.
- The Applicant shall execute a Declaration of Covenants, in a form acceptable to the Township Solicitor, limiting the occupancy of the rental unit in the garage to members of the owner's family or individuals employed on the Property.
- The Applicant shall comply with all other Codes and Ordinances of Upper Makefield Township including, without limitation, the Zoning Ordinance, and the Stormwater Management Ordinance.

• The Applicant shall obtain any and all outside agency permits and approvals as set forth in JMZO Section 803.16.B.

Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Cino and seconded by Mr. Thomas to approve the Weyant Conditional Use Adjudication for 1292 Taylorsville Road subject to the conditions stated above. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

#### Revised LI/O-LI Jointure Ordinance

Ms. Erbele provided an overview of revised LI/O-LI Jointure Ordinance. Discussion followed, and a motion was made by Mr. Cino and seconded by Mr. Weldon to authorize advertisement of the LI/O-LI Jointure Ordinance. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

## **ENGINEER'S REPORT**

Ms. Fuller recommended approval of the Enclave Escrow Release #8 (Final) in the amount \$32,499.99. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Cino and seconded by Mr. Weldon to approve the Enclave Escrow Release #8 (Final). Motion carried by unanimous vote.

# PennDOT Multi Modal Transportation Fund Grant Application

Ms. Fuller provided an overview of the PennDOT Multi Modal Transportation Fund Grant. Discussion followed, and a motion was made by Mr. Cino and seconded by Mr. Weldon to authorize Township Engineer to prepare the PennDOT Multi Modal Transportation Fund Grant Application for sidewalks and crosswalks in Washington Crossing Village. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

#### Jericho Creek at London Court Debris Removal

Ms. Fuller provided an overview of the Jericho Creek at London Court Debris Removal Project. Discussion followed, and a motion was made by Mr. Weldon and seconded by Mr. Thomas to approve the proposal to design, permit, prepare bid documents and provide construction administration for the debris removal within Jericho Creek at London Court. Motion carried by unanimous vote.
